President & CEO

During that time, he did morning weather for local radio stations.

Jackie McClaskey, former Kansas secretary of agriculture, is president and CEO of the American Royal Association and also co-founder of Roots & Legacies, a coaching and




McClaskey's experiences as Kansas secretary of agriculture and president and CEO of the American Royal Association make her a strong leader in professional development, influence building and association management.
