Secretary Tom Vilsack USDA SECRETARY OF AGRICULTURE

Thomas J. Vilsack was confirmed as the 32nd United States Secretary of Agriculture on Feb. 23, 2021, by the U.S. Senate, returning to a role he served for eight years under President Barack Obama. As leader of the U.S. Department of Agriculture as the 30th Secretary of Agriculture between 2009-2017, Vilsack worked hard to strengthen the American agricultural economy, build vibrant rural communities, and create new markets for innovation in rural America. He fought to put Americans back to work by investing in rural infrastructure, renewable energy, and large-scale conservation partnerships. Under his leadership, USDA supported America's farmers, ranchers, and growers who drove the rural economy forward, set records for U.S. agricultural exports, provided food assistance to millions of Americans, and helped provide a safe, sufficient, and nutritious food supply for the American people.

Vilsack was the longest-serving member of President Obama's original cabinet. Prior to his appointment, he served two terms as the governor of lowa, and served in the lowa state senate and as the mayor of Mt. Pleasant, lowa.




