Previously, she served for two years as vice president of government affairs for the National Football League and 11 years in Congress in counsel and coalitions roles for then-House Majority Whip Steve Scalise, House Majority Leader Eric Cantor, Senate Republican Conference Vice Chair John Cornyn, and Senator Chuck Grassley. Gustafson also practiced First Amendment law with Bopp, Coleson & Bostrom. Nicole holds degrees in American history/ government and communications from William Penn University and her J.D. from the University of Iowa.



MANNY CENTENO DHS/FEMA PROGRAM MANAGER

Manny Centeno began serving as a project manager at the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) in June 2010. Now, as a FEMA IPAWS program manager, he leads sustainment, modernization, construction, and operations of the National Public Warning System (NPWS), Nationwide Emergency Alert System (EAS), Primary Entry Point (PEP) network. Centeno designed and deployed a highly capable emergency satellite communications network;

developed and managed the IPAWS Laboratory at the Joint Interoperability Test Command component of the **Defense Information Systems Agency** (DISA); and designed the new NPWS all-hazards communications shelters to support modernization and enhancements of national emergency broadcast capabilities. NPWS shelters include protection against High-Altitude Electromagnetic Pulse (HEMP). The development of these protection schemes is used by the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) as a best practice. Centeno set the foundation for his broadcast and emergency communications career more than 30 years ago as an on-air announcer, manager, marketing executive, and engineer; and he also spent ten years in the film and television industry. He has extensive first-hand experience in operating broadcast stations during disaster response and recovery. Centeno has been an engineer with companies such as 360 Systems in California and ManTech International in Washington, D.C., and he was a specialized technical expert & project manager at the Defense Information Systems Agency (DISA).

10:20-11:15 a.m. Newsmaker Session: Farmers for Soil Health: 30 Million Acres of Cover Crops by 2030

Shawnee Mission

SPONSORS: National Corn Growers Association, National Pork Board, and United Soybean Board

Farmers in 20 states may now enroll in cost-share programs through Farmers for Soil Health. This corn, pork, and soy commodity initiative, in partnership with the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation and USDA's Partnerships for Climate-Smart Commodities, advances conservation practices to improve soil health across the U.S. One of its goals is to double cover crop acres in the U.S. to 30 million acres by 2030. The focus is to bring money directly back to farmers, where sustainability is happening at the farm level. Participating farmers who plant cover crops will receive payments to help transition totaling \$50, spanning three years, per new acre of cover crops planted; or a one-time payment of \$2 per acre

for farmers with existing cover crops. Hear from commodity staff about the program and three farmers' perspectives on planting cover crops and its environmental and economic benefits.

TOM VILSACKU.S. SECRETARY OF
AGRICULTURE

Thomas J. Vilsack was confirmed as the 32nd United States Secretary of Agriculture on February 23, 2021, by the U.S. Senate, returning to a role he served for eight years under President Barack Obama. As leader of the U.S. Department of Agriculture as the 30th Secretary of Agriculture between 2009-2017, Vilsack worked hard to strengthen the American agricultural economy, build vibrant rural communities, and create new markets for innovation in rural America. He fought to put Americans back to work by investing in rural infrastructure, renewable energy, and large-scale conservation partnerships. Under his leadership, USDA supported America's farmers, ranchers, and growers who drove the rural economy forward, set records for U.S. agricultural exports, provided food assistance to millions of Americans, and helped provide a safe, sufficient, and nutritious food supply for the American people. Vilsack was the longest-serving member of President Obama's original cabinet. Prior to his

appointment, he served two terms as the governor of lowa, served in the lowa state senate, and as the mayor of Mt. Pleasant, lowa.

PAM JAHNKE MIDWEST FARM REPORT RADIO NETWORK FARM DIRECTOR

Getting up at 2 in the morning might shock some of her listeners, but for Pam Jahnke, it is part of the business. Raised on a dairy farm just north of Green Bay, Wisconsin, Jahnke grew up surrounded by agriculture. Living on her family's 200-acre dairy farm, she learned the "farm work ethic" first-hand. She has been dedicated to agriculture throughout her life, being actively involved in both 4-H and FFA activities. At the University of Wisconsin-River Falls, Jahnke studied broadcast journalism and broad area agriculture. She started the campus's first ever radio "farm show" and received the top national scholarship from the then National Association of Farm Broadcasters (now, NAFB). After college, she moved into her chosen field, doing farm broadcasting, radio, and television, from Green Bay to Eau Claire, Wisconsin . . . and she has never looked back. Jahnke is a past president of NAFB and was named Farm Broadcaster of the Year in 2013. In 2022, she was inducted into the NAFB Hall of Fame. Jahnke has received many honors, including the "Honorary Recognition" award from UW-Madison's College of Agriculture, her honorary "American FFA Degree." and citations from the Wisconsin State Senate. She has been named "Friend of Agriculture"

by the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture for her assistance in raising awareness of the "Harvest of Hope" program, and she has been honored as "AgriMarketing Person of the Year" by the Badger Chapter of the National AgriMarketing Association (NAMA). In her spare time, Jahnke is active farming in partnership with her brother, sister, and mother on the home farm. To date, the Wisconsin Farm Report network has grown to encompass 26 stations in Wisconsin and Minnesota as well as daily appearances on the CBS TV affiliate in Madison.

Cyndi Young-Puyear is director of Brownfield & Learfield Ag. Her work has earned her dozens of honors from agriculture groups and associations. 


