- RFS: The EPA recently announced that it will finalize biodiesel volumes under the RFS through 2017 by June 1. The biodiesel industry is urging the Administration to propose strong growth in the biodiesel sector, beginning with a baseline of 1.7 billion gallons for 2014, which is consistent with actual production for that year. Biodiesel is the first and only EPA-designated Advanced Biofuel under the RFS to reach commercial-scale production nationwide. Yet the EPA's delays in implementing the RFS have severely destabilized the industry, forcing dozens of producers to idle production or shut down. (Under the law, annual biodiesel volumes under the RFS should be established 14 months prior to the applicable year, so the EPA is late in setting volumes for 2014, 2015 and 2016). The Administration can get the industry back on track with strong policy that gives producers and investors the confidence they need to grow and expand so that we continue to reduce our dependence on petroleum, cut dangerous pollution and create jobs in a new American energy industry.
- Tax Incentive: Congress briefly reinstated the tax incentive last year but, as of Jan. 1, 2015, has again allowed the incentive to expire. It is the fourth time in six years the biodiesel incentive has expired – creating tremendous uncertainty in the industry and making it very difficult for production plants to plan for expansion or hiring.
